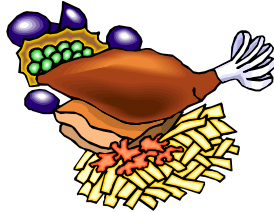

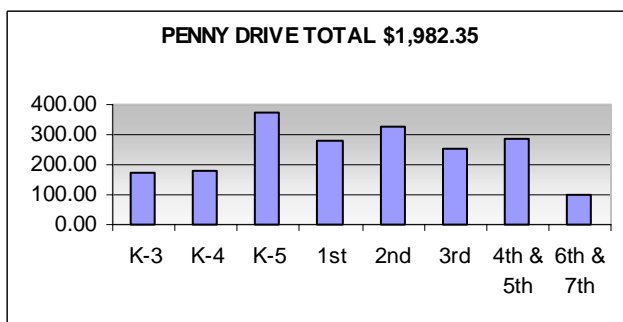

2004 RENOVATIONS

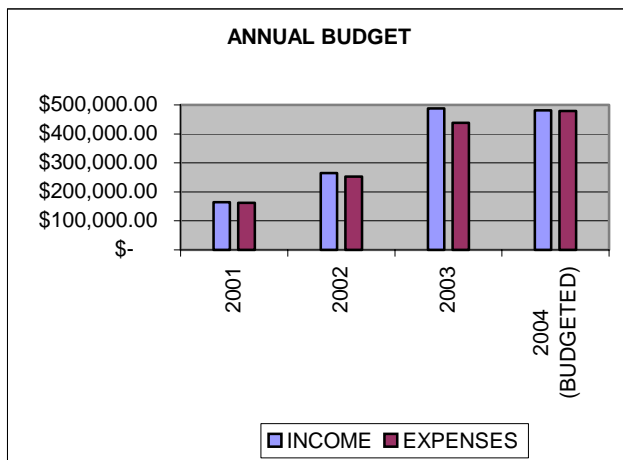
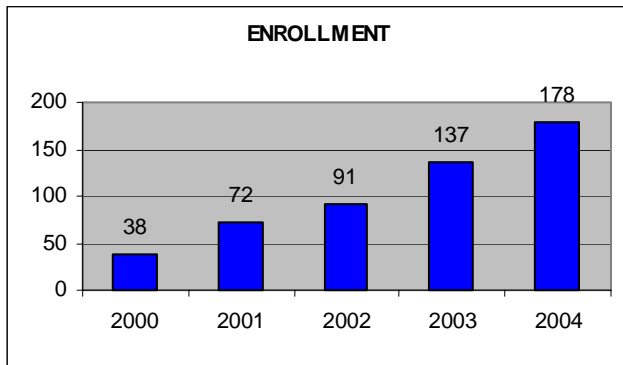
- Asphalt playground area for basketball / volleyball

- Drainage ditches between A and B wings
- Remove grass and lower grade in courtyard area
- Install flag poles

- Install commercial carpeting in all classrooms in C-wing
- Install tile flooring in all bathrooms in C-wing
- Replace bad tiles in hallway of C-wing
